The main objective of the project is to transform young people in conflict affected areas into ambassadors of peace and to contribute to peace at home and in the world, as we mentioned in the project title. The selection of the project partners was carried out in connection with the subject of the project, and it was aimed to achieve the project's goal thanks to the knowledge and experience of the organizations in the countries in the conflict-affected areas. In this context, we will be sharing with you in detail the activities carried out within the scope of our project between January 2023 and March 2024 in this report.

We hope that our project outputs will light your way by creating a spark of peace within you.

• KICK-OFF MEETING IN ISTANBUL

The first step of our project started with a Kick-off meeting organized by our partners in order to plan the administrative processes and share the tasks. This meeting was held between 21-23 February 2023 in Istanbul with the participation of 2 people from each partner organization. In this meeting, the partners had the opportunity to get to know each other better face to face and carried out activities that will give the project an identity such as determining project dissemination strategies, establishing communication channels, and determining the project logo.













• RESEARCH & BOOKLET

To analyze the major trends and differences in partner countries against refugees, research was one of the most crucial steps. With this understanding, all partners engaged in the research process.

With the guidance of our AY Institute and the contributions of all partners, we created a roadmap for the research. The research on the topic "How do national policies in Türkiye, Lebanon, Jordan, Lithuania impact the living standard of refugees" has been successfully conducted through collaborative efforts of the partners. The primary purpose of this research was to explore the effects of national policies on the living conditions of refugees in these four countries and shed light on the challenges displaced populations face.

At the project's outset, project partners defined specific objectives, focusing on understanding the relationship between national refugee policies and refugee living standards. It was aimed to provide valuable insights into the impact of these policies on conflict-affected societies and the inequalities that refugees might encounter. In this line and extensive research was conducted to review existing studies and reports on the impact of national policies on refugee living standards. This literature review helped the partners establish a solid foundation for their research and identify gaps that needed further investigation.

In addition to research, it was necessary to conduct a survey to analyze communities' perspectives in this topic. For this reason, surveys were conducted in the selected communities within each country. Project partners engaged with the local communities (host & refugee communities), administered the study and collected valuable data regarding the living conditions and challenges refugees face.

We are happy to report that as a result of the survey, we have collected 521 responses, 311 of them from the host community and 210 of them from the refugee community. With this division, we aimed to analyze different perspectives of the society.













After data collection, project partners analyzed the survey responses and other relevant data using advanced statistical and qualitative analysis methods. As a result of the analysis conducted by partners, noteworthy correlations between national policies and refugee living standards, offering valuable insights into the impact of policies on displaced populations were discovered.

In this line, at the end of the research, the research findings were compiled into a comprehensive booklet. In the first part of the booklet, the current situation of refugees in Türkiye, Lebanon, Lithuania and Jordan was examined and the opportunity to learn about policies in these countries was provided. In the second part of the booklet, the opportunity to examine the analysis of the responses obtained as a result of the survey conducted on 521 people from the host community and the refugee community was provided and thus gives opportunity to experience the importance of peace more closely.

Overall, the successful implementation of this research has contributed to a deeper understanding of the impact of national policies on refugee living standards, providing valuable information for policymakers and NGOs' efforts to improve the lives of displaced individuals.




• METHODOLOGIES

This task was achieved after the research and booklet and aimed to create specialized methodologies following the training courses in Lebanon and Jordan, making them publicly available to support further peace initiatives and ensure the project's continuity. In this line, a 24-page methodology was prepared by the project partners and published on the project website for public accessibility.

The methodology examined the effectiveness of various peacebuilding activities, including training sessions conducted in Lebanon, local workshops organized in Jordan, Türkiye, Lithuania, and Lebanon, and survey results. By analyzing the outcomes of these initiatives, the methodology aimed to provide clear instructions for youth and youth workers on how they can actively engage as peacebuilders in their communities.

The detailed guidance encompasses strategies and best practices, ensuring that the knowledge and skills gained through the project are effectively transferred and applied in real-world scenarios. Overall, the development and dissemination of this methodology represent a critical step in empowering young people and youth workers to contribute to peacebuilding efforts, fostering more resilient and cohesive communities.





• WEBSITE

The project website was designed by EIG and enriched by the contribution of project partners. To make the Peace at Home, Peace in the World project sustainable even the project ended, the website was one of the most important steps. The main idea of the website is to disseminate the project, and create a space for the project outputs and the data acquired during the project.

On the website, brief information about the project has been given and outputs of the training in Lebanon, research & booklet, methodology and International Peace Conference have been uploaded. Besides, this website was the channel for the online exhibition that was created by the contribution of all partners and photographer & youth worker Antanas Ceponis. Besides, via the newsletter button, you may subscribe to our newsletters to get more information about the project activities. By the end of the 15th March 2024, the website had 591 visitors and we hope to increase this number in the following days.

• LOCAL WORKSHOPS

Local activities were carried out to support conflict-affected people to overcome conflictinduced trauma and support their mental health through art, theatre, youth work, breathing and meditation techniques. In this regard, each partner implemented 8 local events in different topics such as building bridges, learning to listen, accepting differences, understanding the power of the arts for mental well-being and peace advocacy, non-violent communication, let me in – the life of a refugee and more.

In these local events, project partners had opportunity to share and apply the learnings of the trainings & study visit on the conflict affected people and supported them for their well-being. These events created a two-way win-win situation, both in terms of disseminating the project locally and informing youth about the Erasmus+ world, as well as helping youth workers to gain new perspectives.

In these events, thanks to our partners' effort and our participants' willing to participate the local events, we reached a large audience (413 people in total).











• FINAL MEETING

The final meeting in Istanbul was implemented between 8-10 November 2023, at the same time with the International Conference for cost-effectiveness as stated in the Grant Agreement. The meeting was held on the 8th and 9th of November 2023 with the participation of project partners.

In this meeting, partners checked the quality of the deliverables, reached milestones and risks of the project. It was foreseen that to implement the remaining tasks successfully, we need to request an extension. In this regard, the partners agreed to request an extension.

Additionally in the final meeting, upcoming deliverables (methodology and online webinars) were discussed. At the end of the discussion, possible dates for the online webinars and the road map of the methodology were decided.

Finally, the partners had the opportunity to review the flow of the international conference and carry out final checks.















• INTERNATIONAL PEACE CONFERENCE

The International Peace Conference was held on 9th November 2023 in Müze Gazhane in Istanbul, Türkiye. There was a meaningful reason for the choice of location. The choice of Müze Gazhane, which also houses a climate museum, was intended to offer participants the opportunity to visit the climate museum, as well as to draw attention to the climate crisis, which is one of the causes of conflict.

The conference provided a platform to review the progress and the outputs of the "Peace at Home, Peace in the World" project with a large audience. It was organised by EIG with collaboration of GFP, DPNA, and AY. The conference was well attended and successfully organized with the participation of 105 people from 14 different nationalities. We are happy to report that as partners we reached almost double of the estimated participant number.

It had 13 guest speakers including project partners, journalist Diego Cupolo journalist Karolis Sankauskas, peace ambassador Stanislav Karmysov and photographer Antanas Ceponis, and addressed current global issues, including the conflict in Ukraine & Palestine, and geopolitical tensions. Various activities were conducted during the conference and digital tools like "Mentimeter" were used to maintain the participants' interest and support active participation.

Project partners shared challenges, stories, research results and memorable moments from their "Peace at Home, Peace in the World" journeys and the spirit of Erasmus+ was reflected in the conference with energizers.

With the contribution of Mr. Antanas Ceponis and Mr. Eduardas Pontezis's, the event space was decorated with photographs from the conflict affected areas of Hatay (city of Türkiye) and Ukraine, and the participants were deeply touched by this exhibition that emphasized the importance of peace. Besides, the online exhibition that is created by the project partners was projected for the interest of the participants.

For the dissemination activities of the conference, before the conference day, announcement posts and stories were shared via partners' social media accounts and after the conference, an after movie and dissemination posts were shared to reach wider audience.

The International Peace Conference was an event that we enjoyed preparing and participating in. Once again, we would like to extend our love and respect to all our participants, in the hope that among those who read our report, there are some who attended our conference. Thank you for not leaving us alone on our Peace at Home Peace in the World journey.

• ONLINE WEBINARS

As a collaborative effort of EIG, AY, DPNA, and GFP organised online webinars as a key activity of the project. These webinars were held online and involved presentations, discussions, and interactive elements, providing a platform for knowledge-sharing and collaboration among participants. Online webinars addressed two primary topics.



The first webinar's topic was "Empowering Youth Through Conflict Resolution: Building Bridges to Lasting Peace" and with the participation of 70 people, it was held on 30th January 2024 online. In this webinar, the role of youth in conflict resolution and transformation was highlighted. It outlined the steps that youth can take to contribute to peaceful resolutions, providing a platform for participants to engage in open discussions about their concerns and share best practices.

The second webinar's topic was "The Middle East Tensions: The Potential Catalyst for World War III" and with the participation of 41 people, it was held on 26th March 2024 online. In this webinar, partners from the conflict-affected areas discussed the region's problems and the tension in the Middle East. In this webinar, our partner from Lebanon made a presentation that enabled the participants to learn the subject more easily and with fun. In the presentation, he summarized the situation in Lebanon through how to cook Tabbouleh, the traditional dish of Lebanon, and made a memorable narration.

Thanks to our participants and guest speakers, the webinars allowed us to develop different perspectives and facilitated peaceful discussions.











• **DISSEMINATION ACTIVITIES**

Dissemination activities are a crucial component of any project, especially those funded by public or international organizations such as the European Union's Erasmus+ program. These activities ensure that the project's results and benefits are shared with a wider audience, thereby maximizing the project's impact and fostering sustainability. For this reason, as Peace at Home Peace in the World partners, we created social media campaigns and put effort into disseminating the project.

In this regard, EIG carried out a branding campaign and selected the appropriate colours at the beginning of the project.
